We are born of the incorruptible seed of Christ, and all things were made new – the old is gone. We have the DNA of Jesus on the inside of us. It's no wonder that if satan would have understood that Jesus would be the first of many sons, he would not have crucified the Lord of Glory. 1 John 4 tells us that as He is, so are we.  - Isaiah 11.2 says that Jesus will have the Spirit of Wisdom rest on Him.
 - 1 John 4 says that as Jesus is, so are we.

¹⁷ I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, **may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better.**

- One of the purposes of the Spirit of Wisdom is to reveal Father God to you. Reveal to you His attributes, His ways, His goodness, His love, how He thinks, what pleases Him.
- Then you can discern what is of God and what is not by the Spirit of Wisdom.

Wisdom gives **insight for success** through God-inspired thoughts (1 Cor 2).

Wisdom will warn you, if you stop to listen.

Stubbornness opposes wisdom.

Wisdom brings correction.

Listen to wisdom and live in undisturbed peace, free from fear, confident and courageous.

Wisdom is a shelter from the storms of life.
